

San Rafael High School Community Notice




Construction of the new building at San Rafael High School (SRHS) is underway! The contractor has completed 270 drilling piers and is working on the foundations - installing reinforcing prior to concrete pours to begin later this summer. By fall, we expect them to be erecting the structural steel frame for the building. This new building will include a new student services center, a student commons that includes a cafeteria, the District's central kitchen, new administration offices, and replacement of Madrone High School.

As part of a grant from the California Energy Commission and PG&E, we will also be starting work on electric vehicle charging stations at SRHS.

As that is going on, the front parking lot will be (mostly) closed for the summer in order to install underground utilities, build a new trash enclosure, and make changes to the 3rd Street sidewalk to eliminate the turnout along the front of the school and provide more parking. This work should be completed and the lot re-opened in time for staff to return prior to the start of school in August.



We have already started planning and design for the next building - a new Science-Technology-Engineering-Math (STEM) building to be located in place of the current cafeteria building once the new building is complete. The STEM building will include state-of-the-art science classrooms, a new Fabrication Lab, and classrooms to support the Career Technical Education (CTE) program. The design will be reviewed with San Rafael High School's Site Design Committee in September.
