

# Terra Linda High School Community Update

## Street, Pedestrian & Bicycle Access Improvements Project

### Construction Begins Soon

Construction of the new Competition Gymnasium and Frontage Improvement Project will be completed in two phases. The construction documents for the first phase will be approved by the Division of the State Architect in just a few days. This first phase will include the demolition of the existing cafeteria building, and the removal of the asphalt and concrete paving around the existing circular entrance drive. There will also be significant excavations along Nova Albion Way in preparation for undergrounding the overhead utilities along the right-of-way. Many of the new utility services will be installed in this phase of the project. The removal of the Monterey Cypress trees along Nova Albion Way will be one of the first tasks of renewing and updating the frontage of the school. The existing trees have been evaluated by an arborist and have been found to be diseased and at the end of their life. They will be replaced with beautiful Crape Myrtles which are approved City of San Rafael street trees.

Access to the campus will be maintained at several locations. The northwest driveway, across from El Pavo Real Circle, leading to the District Office and the Faculty and Staff parking lot will remain open. A new entrance driveway will be constructed adjacent to the existing Gymnasium that will allow access to the eastern Student Parking Lot. A fenced passageway from that lot

will allow for safe pedestrian access to the existing Gymnasium and the rest of the campus that will be separated from the construction zone.

The construction work of Phase 1 will begin in March and will continue on through the summer. Phase 2 is anticipated to begin in July.

Phase 2 of the project is the actual construction of the new Competition Gymnasium facilities and the related site work. The target for completion of the construction is the Fall of 2022 in time for the return of students to the campus for the '22-'23 school year.
